# SPEED LIMITS



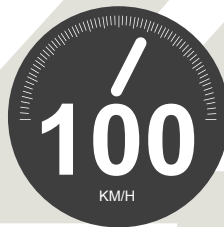
## Autobahn

130KPH is the recommended speed if not shown differently

# DOs

- ✓ **At roundabouts always give priority to traffic coming from the left**
- ✓ **Turn off speed camera detection on sat nav devices**
- ✓ **Wear a seatbelt in the car - no matter where you are sitting**
- ✓ **Drive on the right side of the road**

# Don'ts

## ✘ Run out of petrol on a motorway

You could be fined and face further consequences if you run out of petrol and don't have a good reason why.

## ✘ Use your phone while driving

You can face a fine of €70 if you use your phone while waiting at the traffic lights or while driving.

## ✘ Forget to put on winter tyres before you drive in wintry conditions

You can face a fine of €70 if you don't have winter tyres fitted (recommended from October).

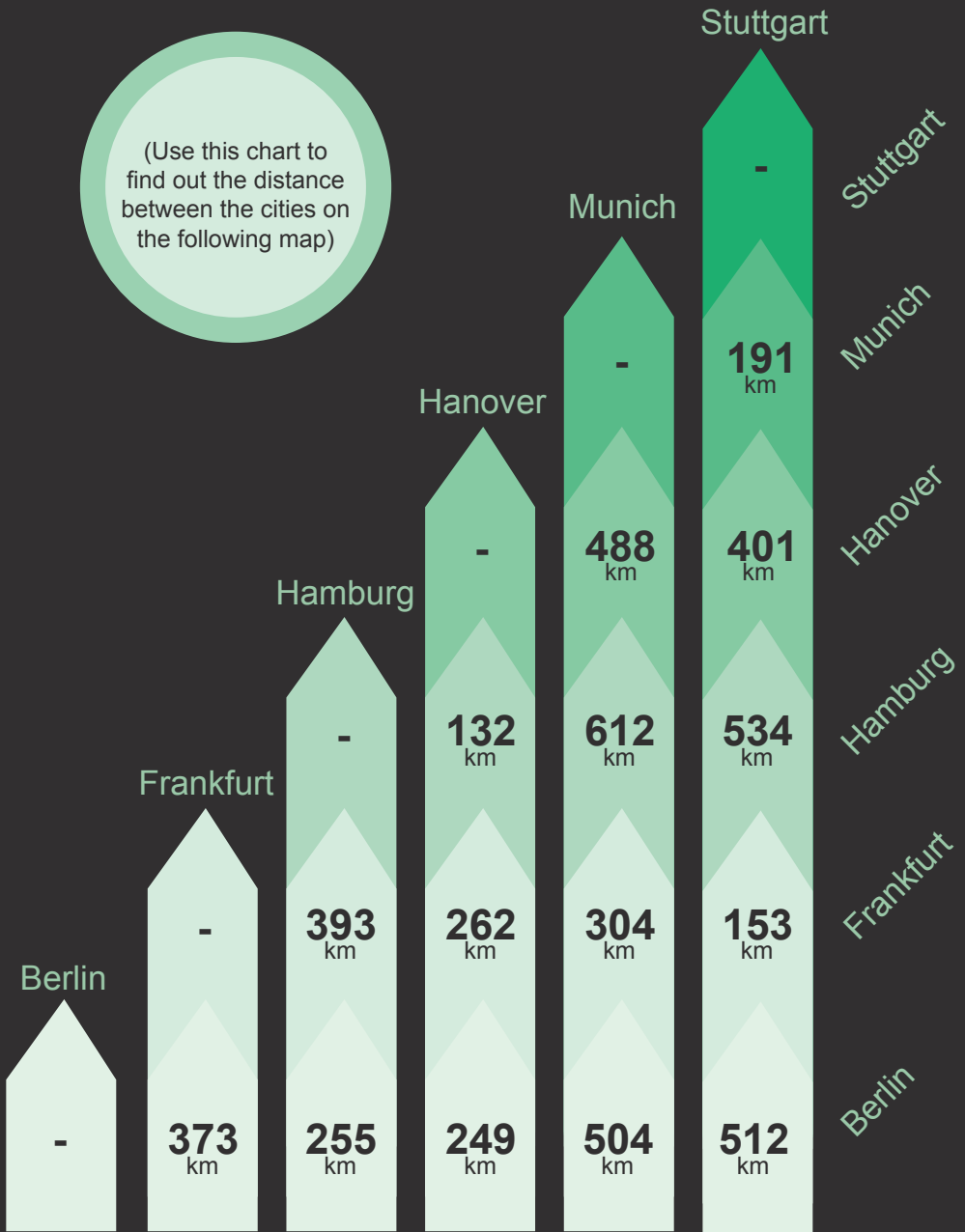
## ✘ Swear at people while driving

Or make a rude hand gesture, you could be fined up to €4,000.
